The writer of this article is David Papineau. Papineau is a philosopher who also works as a professor at King's College in London. He has written several books including one called Knowing the Score: How Sports Teach Us about Philosophy. He seems to be very knowledgeable on sports and human nature. The article serves the purpose of arguing that when players pretend they are injured for the sake of the game they "degrade themselves by their cheap deception" just like Qatar degrades itself with its laws.

Professor Papineau is targeting people who dismiss others because they don't agree with the same principles and morals. He states, "Different conventions, in sports as in society in general, can be equally and morally acceptable. But it doesn't follow that there are no immoral convections." Papineau is implying that just like playacting can be seen as demeaning, there are places in the world where people of high power do things that demean others. Those who dismiss these things happening in the world because they are not affected by them are allowing immoral things to happen. The writer uses a disappointing tone throughout the article implying that he is disappointed in society. He explains that play acting in sports, "isn't something that might be incorporated into a healthy sporting practice, only more than slavery might be incorporated into a

healthy civil society." Meaning that when we allow morally unjust things to happen in sports it's the same as allowing unjust treatment in society.
